IN PROFILE WITH... PROFESSOR SALLY-ANN BURNETT

PLEASE TELL US ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR ROLE TERRITYS

AT BPP UNIVERSITY?

I have been at BPP for 8 years and am now Deputy Vice-Chancellor. This is my third role at BPP and includes ensuring that students are at the heart of all our decisions. I have responsibility for the university's partnership with the Students' Association and have university-wide responsibility for ensuring our regulatory requirements are met. I also work to ensure that the university is appropriately connected with and supported by BPP Group functions including admissions, marketing and finance.

• WITH SUCH A SENIOR ROLE, DO YOU HAVE ANY TIME FOR HOBBIES AND INTERESTS?

Everyone has 24 hours a day – what they do with those 24 hours is up to them! I make sure I keep my life balanced and give time and space for my batteries to recharge. I love hiking, cooking, live music, keeping fit and experiencing different countries and their cultures. I also love being in the moment and taking time with friends. I always try to have humility and to have gratitude as these are qualities I admire in others.

MENTAL HEALTH, SOCIAL MEDIA & YOUNG WOMEN - A RECIPE FOR ...?

Many thanks for taking the time to visit and read by blog post today. My name is Shireen and I am currently in my first year of studying Adult Nursing at BPP and I am also the founder of a medispa known as Hannah London. When it came to writing this blog, I decided to focus on how the use of social media today can be seen to affect the mental health of women (young women in particular).

From learning about mental health in the first year of degree study so far, it has become apparent as to how prevalent mental health problems are today. These problems and issues are unfortunately manifesting in dangerous and deadly behaviour, as you no doubt will have seen in the news; with the likes of attacks, stabbings and suicides being commonplace within the younger generation.

To best illustrate this point, I think it makes sense at this stage to share some facts on figures about the social media platform known as Instagram and to how the likes of social media can be seen to feed into the above mentioned problems.

- Estimates say that over one billion people use Instagram (with 500 million of them actively using it every day). The only social media / networks that exceed this number are Facebook and YouTube.
- Just over one quarter of these Instagram users (25.2%) are said to be between the ages of 25 and 34; while just over one fifth of them (20.6%) are said to be between the ages of 18 and 24.
- As of July 2018, it is estimated that 50.3% of all Instagram users are female.

Studies surrounding these figures have made a link between various states of mental reaction when women from certain age brackets use the platform. For example, some have showed that those in the 18 - 24 age bracket felt growing insecurity about their body image when viewing images on the app. Those slightly older (in the 25 - 34 age bracket) were said to feel inadequate about their careers and overall lifestyle. In both of these scenarios, it was their comparing of their reality to the curated images they were seeing on the app causing these negative feelings and to feel that their output lacked meaning. As the saying goes, comparison is the thief of joy.

As mentioned above, I am the founder of Hannah London - a medispa based in North London. One day a client came to the medispa and she was in her early 20's. She was looking to get both lip filler and skin peel treatments. When talking to her, I couldn't help but notice that she already seemed

to have guite a lot of facial treatments done to her face already and so something came to mind. Just the week previously, I had learned about the 'iceberg theory' in university - this being that there is something deeper to be addressed than what can only be seen.

At her consultation for the requested treatments, I asked her why she was looking to get them done. I advised her, as a senior therapist, that I did not believe that she either needed them or would benefit from them from an aesthetic point of view. I was shocked and surprised to hear her reply as she explained that she thought she was 'ugly' and did not look good enough to go out in public without people looking at her and thinking she was ugly.

In that moment I was like a swan on a lake. Looking calm and graceful while thrashing my legs under the surface of the water to stay afloat. At the same time, I felt both sorry for her that she felt that way,

but also Instagram app on her mobile phone and scrolled through seemingly endless pictures of lips which are deemed to have the perfect proportions, skin tweaked and filtered to perfection and teeth gone way beyond naturally white. It really angered me that other clinics and salons were happy to carry out treatments like this on such young and impressionable people and so I firmly told her that I would not administer the treatments she requested as she did not need them.

Instead I offered her a massage to ease her tensions about her appearance while explaining that the images she has been consuming have been edited beyond belief and are highly unrealistic. She opened up to me and I learned that she has some passions in life including charity work – things far more important and worthwhile than images. I encouraged her to invest her time and thinking into areas like these and not on trivial social media false realities.

I want to raise awareness on how social media platforms such as Instagram can impact the mental health of everyone especially young women, as this can have long term effects and create and maintain unrealistic body image standards. I would not have realised this so much if it wasn't for my nursing degree and I am enjoying every moment of learning about the human mind and body and the external factors that can affect health. I hope through being a nurse and having a business that I can start something in the future for these young women who just need someone to talk to.

When and where?

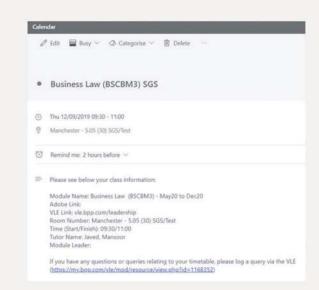
What to expect from your Office 365 Timetable?

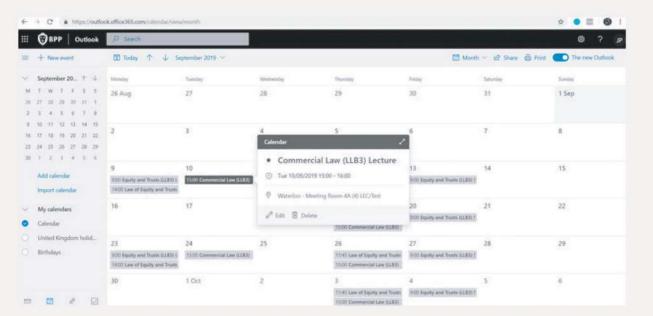
All timetabled teaching activities will appear in your Office 365 Calendar once timetables are released for each term.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Learning Support Team have worked with over 3000 students putting Reasonable Adjustments in place for exams and on course support. This helps students to meet their required deadlines whilst feeling supported. We work with students who have many different diagnosed health conditions/ disabilities to include learning difficulties and both physical and mental health conditions. We work with students who have both long term and short term conditions.

COMMON STUDENT QUERIES

"Most the time my health is good; I don't know when it will negatively affect me"

We provide Reasonable Adjustments to support students for this very reason. For example, if you have diagnosed Anxiety and it may be exasperated in exams we can offer rest breaks or extra writing time to support you. If you are able to finish the exam without using adjustments, that's absolutely fine but the adjustments are there as a safety net to give you confidence to sit the exams.

"I am struggling with my exams/ course but I don't have a known diagnosis"

Often we work with students who need support but have never spoken to anyone about it. Our Advisors can work with students to understand their barriers to learning and plan to get support. This often helps students to sit their exams on time feeling more prepared. We do require a months' notice to put adjustments in place however if you are worried about obtaining evidence or feel you have left things last minute – please still have a chat with us as we do want to ensure you are aware of all your options!

"If I get extra support in exams or on my course will my future employers find out?"

Your information is kept confidential within our service and we would not disclose your medical evidence or arrangements to anyone outside of the university. Within the University we would also need your expressed consent to share any information.

"I am worried about speaking about my health/ personal problems"

We are a team of friendly and supportive Advisors who have a wealth of experience. We often have students speak to us for the first time about their worries and we ensure we offer a safe, empathetic and non-judgemental space.

BPP PRO BONO CENTRE



The BPP University Pro Bono Centre has always prided itself on being award winning and, this Autumn, it may well be adding more trophies to its collection, having been shortlisted for not one, but two prestigious national awards.

The BPP Pro Bono Centre's Streetlaw Team has been shortlisted for 'Excellence in Pro Bono' in the Law Society's Excellence Awards 2019.

The shortlist focused on two strategic aspects of the Streetlaw project: (1) the way it which it encourages young people to engage as active citizens in society, allowing them to make safe, smart and legal choices about their use of social media; (2) the fact it aligns with the Solicitor General's 10 Year Vision for Public Legal Education.

This year, the BPP Pro Bono Centre's Streetlaw teams have worked with over 450 BPP law student volunteers at 7 BPP sites, together delivering over 350 hours of free public legal education ("PLE") to community groups.

The BPP University Pro Bono Centre has also been shortlisted in the UK Social Mobility Awards 2019, in the category of the Leadership Award.

The UK Social Mobility Awards recognise and encourage action that will promote and increase social mobility within Britain's companies and institutions. The Awards celebrate excellence and achievement in initiatives that elevate social mobility as a cause equal to the level of other diversity issues. The Leadership Award recognises those companies and institutions that have taken their commitment to social mobility to new places in unexpected ways, affecting systemic change along the way.



BPP University has been shortlisted for the BPP Pro Bono Centre's Law Ambassador Programme ('LAP'). Launched in 2017, the LAP is a trailblazing initiative designed to improve social mobility in the legal profession, by enabling law firms and law students to work together to raise the career aspirations of young people from a diverse range of social-economic backgrounds. Through a unique two year partnership between schools, law firms and BPP University, sixth form students are educated about the law, develop skills to boost employability and have their pre-conceptions about legal careers being out of reach, challenged. The LAP currently supports over 50 Law Ambassadors attending six local comprehensive schools in Leeds, and will take on new cohorts next year. Partnering with law firms with a national presence has created a blueprint for a sustainable national social mobility programme, capable of replication anywhere.

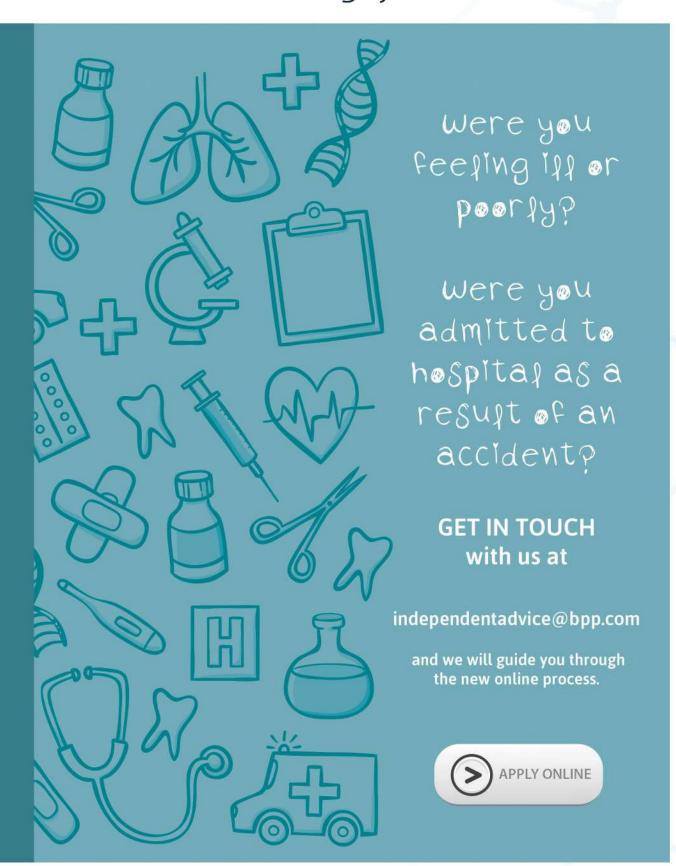
ONLINE SUBMISSIONS REQUIRED

What can you expect during the exam? As we are in the mist of the examination period, we thought that it would be helpful to let you know what you can expect on the day of your exam. Whether you are sitting in the main venue or have specific examination arrangements the rules below will apply

Deferrals

If you are seeking a deferral for your exams, please go to the VLE under Home / Registry / Forms and Guidance (top of your home page) to complete your deferral form. Your form should be sent to your Programme Leader by 12.00 noon the working day before the date of the examination or assessment. If you do not receive a confirmation of your deferral, you should assume that it has not been granted

and you will be expected to sit the examination or assessment.

If you are seeking an update on your deferral application, please email the Programme Leader by emailing the inbox you send your deferral application to. The University Assessment Office will not be able to help with the deferrals as we have no authority to grant these and have no oversight of the progress of the application.

EXAMS AT BPP

Before your exam

- 1. The dates of your exams will be released to you on the VLE at the beginning of your course.
- 2. Your exams may take place at either at one of BPP centres or one of the external venues please ensure that you check this information prior to your exam so that you know which venue you should be going to. We cannot guarantee that all your examinations will take place at the same venue (this will depend on the size of the exam and venue availability), therefore it is important not to assume that you are going to the same place as last time. The venue information is available from the VLE under Home > Assessments > Your programme

The venue information will be released on the VLE at least 2 weeks prior to the exam date.

If you have specific arrangements for your exams, you will receive an email 2 weeks prior to the exam, detailing what the provisions will be.

- 3. As there are specific annotation rules, please familiarise yourself with these so that you can remove anything that should not be in your book prior to the exam and avoid having it confiscated on the day. Be aware that the materials will be checked at the beginning of each exam by the invigilators we will do this as quickly as we can so we do not disturb you.
- 4. Lastly, please allow plenty of time to get to the venue! Include time that may take if the trains are delayed, you are stuck in traffic etc.

On the day of the exam

1. Your desk number will be available on the day of the examination at the venue. Your SRN will appear on the list with the allocated desk number and the section you are in (we will have colour coded sections). The students will be let into the room between 15-30 mins prior to the exam. This is to give you plenty of time to find a seat and settle in.

You might be in a room with students studying other programmes/modules thus please do check that you are sitting in the right seat.

- 2. Once you are in the room, you are under examination conditions and therefore should not communicate with your colleagues or start reading the exam paper!
- 3. Shortly before the exam begins you will hear the examination instructions. You will be informed when you can start writing.
- 4. You will be given all the materials that you need for your exams so please just make sure you have your permitted materials with you. The rough paper is attached to the back of the exam paper.

If you need any extra paper to write your answers on, indicate to the invigilator and they will give an answer booklet or some continuation sheets that you will need to attach to your main answer booklet.

- 5. We will give you time warnings before the exam will finish.
- 6. We will collect the answer booklets and other materials you will not be permitted to take home any other materials we give you. We then have to count the papers to make sure that we collected all of them. Once we have them all, we will let you leave the examination room.

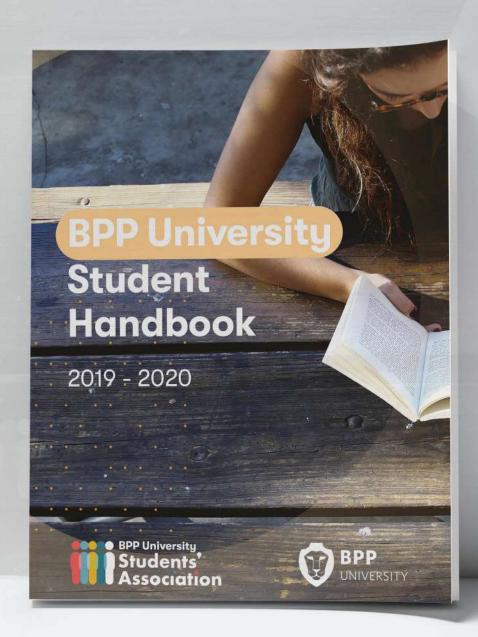

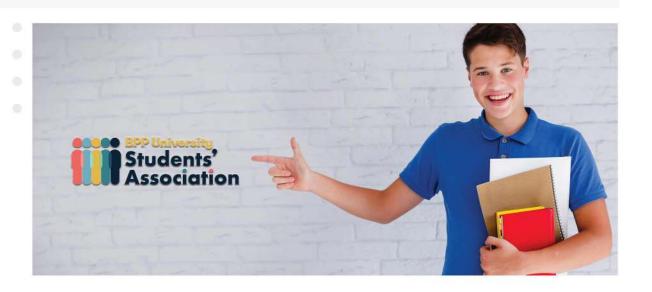

SOLIDARITEE AT BPP

SolidariTee* is a student-led campaign which sells t-shirts for £10 to donate money to NGOs providing legal aid for refugees and asylum seekers in Greece. As well as supporting the work of these NGOs, the campaign also seeks to provide grants for long-term volunteer placements at NGOs.

SolidariTee started in 2017 at Cambridge University by student Tiara Sahar Ataii to highlight the experience of refugees crossing the Mediterranean, having worked as an interpreter for legal aid NGOs in Greece. Over 30 universities are now participating in the campaign including universities in the US, France, Germany, Jordan and Australia. BPP's participation in the movement is significant as it is the first time it has gained support from students at a legal institution. It has made over £45,000 in sales since its inception.





Each year the t-shirts have a different design. This year's designs have been created by the Sudanese artist Dar Al Naim with motifs of figures, boats and water evoking scenes depicted in the media of refugees crossing the Mediterranean.

AN INTERVIEW WITH STEVE PENFOLD

My career started aged 16 when I left home to join the Army 6th form at Welbeck college. After completing my A levels - Maths, Physics and Chemistry - I attended Cranfield University, which ran degree courses for armed forces personnel. With a degree in electronic engineering, I progressed to Sandhurst to complete the Army officers' commission course and joined the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (REME). The role of the REME is to ensure that all Army equipment is fit for purpose, and I worked with colleagues across a wide range of Army branches.

At 36, I left the Army and in January 2011, started the GDL at BPP. I enjoyed the smaller classes which, with a majority of more mature students, was a fun group who got on well together. I found the course satisfying and particularly valued the opportunity to study a subject I had chosen and committed to, having left my previous career in the Army.

My plan was to finish the GDL in August 2011 and start the LPC in September. As part of the GDL, I undertook a work placement at Plexus Law in Leeds. One of the partners there offered me a paralegal role with study, in order to complete my LPC. So I coordinated work and study by enrolling in the LPC on the BPP part time evening course. Working full time and studying for the LPC was hard work, but I used my time effectively and found that the theory and practice fitted together well. This was particularly evident working as a personal injury defence paralegal. I saw a lot of crossover with my civil litigation module whilst conducting telephone court appearances as well as completing court forms and other defence documents.

I am a big advocate of having paralegal experience on your CV to make you more competitive and attractive to recruiters. When making training contract applications it shapes your understanding of the skills you need to demonstrate to employers. I also felt that my interviews went better because of my knowledge of the legal profession in practice. My commercial awareness allowed me to see the bigger picture and be more aware of what recruiters were looking for. I already had a number of their required competencies and together with my legal experience, was able to evidence my claim I had what they were looking for.

Half way through my part time LPC, I applied for a training contract at Eversheds. Working as a paralegal was one of the key factors in making my application to Eversheds a success. I was drawn to Eversheds following a presentation by Steve Bloomer, who outlined the firm's emphasis on competency based recruitment. As a mature candidate, this suited me, as I had a wider range of life experiences which I could draw upon at interview.

Eversheds offered me a place on their vac scheme, which was great fun. I was able to see different parts of the firm and get involved in a range of events. This experience convinced me it was the right firm for me. I was offered a training contract after the scheme, using the interim period to compete my remaining LPC electives on a full time course - leaving the part time study behind.

I started my training contract with Eversheds the following September. Most of the other trainees were mature students and had come from a range of different university backgrounds. This gave me a positive view that Eversheds was more interested in the skills and experience their trainees could bring to the firm, rather than which universities and schools the trainees went to.

Having completed my training contract, I knew I wanted to qualify into Tax. During the LPC, I had identified that tax featured in almost every module on the course and whilst my peers hated it,

I really enjoyed this aspect. My colleagues didn't seem to be interested in tax, but I could see there was demand for this specialist area, which meant that tax services were harder to find and commanded a premium. I noticed that many law firmed were obliged to heavily discount rates to clients for legal services in the real estate and employment sectors because of the intense competition between firms for these services. In the tax department, we rarely had to offer discounted rates as it is such a specialist area. The tax partner at Eversheds charged out the Leeds lawyers at the same rate as London, because our advice was considered so specialised. I therefore recognise the value of qualifying into a specialist area of law for which there is a high demand.

Within the tax department at Eversheds, I further specialised in employee share incentives. I spent three and a half years at Eversheds post qualification working in this practice area as it was a part of the business I really enjoyed.

Employee share incentives are used by many companies to help with their employee engagement. Frequently forming part of the overall employee package, they can be used as both a recruitment and retention tool. They also offer employees an opportunity to share in the success of the business.

Tapestry Compliance is a boutique law firm which specialises in all aspects of employee and executive share incentives and was set up in 2011 by a former Linklaters partner, Janet Cooper OBE, and a Linklaters lawyer, Bob Grayson, who had worked in the incentives team at Linklaters and who had also worked in-house, responsible for Shell's global plans. Together, their experience brought both a legal as well as a practical, business perspective.

About 3 years ago, Tapestry opened a Leeds office, which is where I now work. I joined in February 2018, attracted by their impressive range world class clients and challenging global work for those clients, but also their non-traditional, future thinking approach to legal practice.

The firm was set up with the philosophy that lawyers can have a fulfilling legal career - working with great clients, doing stimulating and challenging work - but in a more sustainable and fun way. Where lawyers are able to do the interesting, multi-jurisdictional work experienced in the City, without the often excessive long hours demanded by most of the larger firms.

Our team based approach means anyone can be involved in decision making for the business, and Tapestry sets itself apart with its commitment to flexible and agile working. With offices in Yorkshire, Tapestry is growing at around 25% a year.





Although Tapestry is a specialist firm, we work with many of the biggest companies worldwide as well as around 30% of the FTSE 100 including Aviva, HSBC, Rolls Royce and Schroders. Our clients also include Dell, TripAdvisor, Rolls-Royce, , Goldman Sachs, , Morgan Stanley and Credit Suisse.

A key part of Tapestry's work is helping global companies manage their employee share incentives, so that their incentive plans are compliant with the local law in each country they have employees. For example, offering shares in the UK is a regulated activity but there are exemptions available where a company offers shares as part of an incentive scheme to its employees. However, not all countries, such as China, have this exemption to their securities laws available, and companies must be careful that their employee share incentive plans do not breach local law. Tapestry helps companies navigate the different local laws and regulations.

Our work covers all the major jurisdictions and many more. The largest share plan we have worked in recently was for Unilever in over 110 countries! In a recent case, a Spanish client couldn't offer their Australian employees the same share incentive package as other employees across the globe, due to the Australian regulations. We were able to help them apply for a special exemption from the Australian authorities, allowing them to roll out the plan to employees based there too. The firm has developed a leading 'LegalTech' service for our clients to enable clients to have access to up-to-date legal and tax information about operating share plans in over 100 countries. Companies like TripAdvisor use this service.

AN INTERVIEW WITH STEVE PENFOLD

For me, I recently had the opportunity to travel to Japan to help build Tapestry's practice there and have a second trip planned for November. Another colleague of mine has travelled to New York to help Tapestry build its financial services practice. There are plenty of opportunities to travel with the firm due to its global reach for those who want to travel, some who have commitments stay closer to home. I also recognise the value in having a range of outside interests which working at Tapestry has enabled me to pursue.

In my spare time, I have a few hobbies, but my main interest is hang gliding. I learnt to fly whilst I was in the Army, and I soon progressed to flying competitively. I love the sport as it combines the absolute freedom of flying with the fun and excitement of testing yourself against others in a competition. Since re-training as a solicitor, I've continued to fly and I'm just about to go to Spain to compete in the Catalonian open and the British National Championships.
