A reminder of our Covid-19 safety measures – 01.11.21

In light of the backdrop of rising Covid-19 case numbers, and various speculation in the media, we wanted to reinforce some of our Covid-19 safety measures when attending a BPP study centre.

Testing and vaccinations

- We continue to strongly encourage all students to test twice weekly. Testing kits are now
 available at all BPP study centre reception desks, as well as being readily available free from
 pharmacies and the government website.
- We continue to strongly recommend that you take the opportunity to receive both vaccines when invited, and any boosters applicable.

Face coverings

We believe in taking personal responsibility in providing protection, reassurance and showing respect to others to ensure we keep everyone safe. For this reason, we continue to firmly recommend that face coverings are worn when travelling around a BPP study centre. We support and respect those who wish to wear them in all settings including classrooms.

Reporting

If you:

- Have tested positive for Covid-19
- Are otherwise self-isolating at the request of the NHS, (e.g., as a result of suspected contact with a confirmed Covid-19 case)

You are required to complete the incident report form here.

Social distancing

Please maintain as much social distancing as you can whilst travelling around the building.

We will continue to implement the following key safety measures within our centres:

- Enhanced frequency of cleaning alongside a dedicated Covid-19 cleaning risk assessment
- Additional handwashing facilities/hand sanitisers at all centres, including at entrances, exits and regular touchpoints
- Wipes and cleaning products at touch points, including printers and computers
- Plexiglass screens at receptions and enquiry desks
- Keeping shared spaces well ventilated
