

# Learner Voice Representative Role (LVR)

2 LVRs per programme



## Core Elements of the Role

### Represent and Communicate Learner Perspectives

Act as the voice of learners by gathering and sharing feedback, ensuring diverse perspectives are recognised, and acting as a key link between apprentices, employers, and the University.

### Support Dialogue and Relationships

Promote open, confidential, and constructive discussions among peers while fostering strong, positive relationships with all stakeholders.

### Enhance Quality Through Feedback

Offer insights that drive continuous improvement, engage in surveys and focus groups, and help shape programme development and learner support services.

### Time Commitments

- Training: 1 hour (online)
- Monthly Focus Groups: 1 hour (online)
- Peer Engagement & Feedback: Flexible, based on how much time individuals choose to invest in liaising with peers and providing feedback.

## Optional Elements

### Build Community Across BPP

- Network with learners from different cohorts, disciplines, and apprenticeship pathways.
- Attend University and Students' Association events to strengthen learner community and engagement.

### Represent Learner Voice

- Speak on behalf of your cohort at Boards, Committees, and formal meetings.
- Raise feedback constructively and ensure the learner experience remains a central focus in discussions.

### Support New Learners

- Participate in apprentice inductions by welcoming new learners and explaining the purpose and value of the Learner Voice role.

### Participate in Events & Community Activities

- Engage in Students' Association activities to promote a sense of belonging and encourage involvement beyond academic or workplace requirements.

### Grow Your Professional Network

- Build relationships with BPP Senior Management and staff through regular meetings and collaborative activities.
- Develop leadership, communication, and advocacy skills through active engagement.

### Undertake Key Training

- Complete the halfday Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) awareness training to support peers appropriately and know when to signpost.
