

Sexual Assault Referral Centres (SARCs)

The NHS have set up dedicated <u>Sexual Assault Referral Centres (SARCs)</u> which offer medical, practical and emotional support to anyone who has been raped, sexually assaulted or abused.

- These centres are open and available for everyone, regardless of gender, age, the type of incident or when it happened.
- They offer a range of services, including crisis care, medical and forensic examinations, emergency contraception, and STI testing.
- They can also arrange access to an independent sexual assault advisor (ISVA), as well as referrals to mental health support and sexual violence support services.

You can get help from a SARC by booking an appointment with your nearest one. You can find your closest SARC on the NHS website <u>HERE</u>.
